TELEVISION AND RADIO APPEARANCES:

Jack Rudloe began displaying creatures when he was six, bringing his pet alligator on the Brooklyn show, *Murray's Pets*. Even before it was published, he promoted his first book, *The Sea Brings Forth* (Knopf) CBS's popular program *To Tell The Truth*" in 1964 where he was featured as the Ocean Going Creature Collector. When the book was published in 1968, Hugh Downs and Barbara Walters interviewed him on the on the *NBC Today Show*, while he held up live horseshoe crabs, sea hares and horses. In 1971 he was back on the *Today Show* to promote *The Erotic Ocean*, then the *Living Dock* in 1977 and *Time of the Turtle* in 1981.

In 1976, Jack Rudloe appeared on CBS's *Good Morning America* holding up his books and a giant sea roach giant sea roach, captured on a New York Zoological Society Expedition. Showing a live Kemp's ridley sea turtle, Rudloe urged commercial fishermen to start using Turtle Excluder Devices. He has used the national media to promote jellyfish as food and other conservation causes on dozens of radio and television program, including a national feed Public Radio *All Things Considered* in 1988. A year later when the Exxon Valdese spilled oil, Rudloe sealed up his credit card in a bag of oil and sent it back to Exxon. Viewers watched him do it on *CBS Evening News*, which aired on over fifty television stations, and AP radio worldwide.

In 2001, after a rash of shark attacks, he appeared Fox Network's show *Edge* with Paul Zhan to explain the role of sharks in the ocean's ecosystem and urging people not to start randomly killing them. In the same year Jay Leno display an AP photo of Rudloe and a Kemp's Ridley turtle on the *NBC Tonight Show*. The following year Rudloe traveled to Malaysia and China to learn how to process jellyfish for food to help commercial fishermen being put of work by the Florida Net Ban. Upon returning, in 1992 he began a media with a front page article in the *Wall Street Journal*, the *New York Times* and dozens of regional newspapers and magazines, along with an interview on the *CBS Evening News* and *Yam Can Cook*, a PBS Chinese cooking show. A dozen regional television and radio shows followed.

He and his wife, Anne Rudloe have also been featured in numerous national radio and television documentaries, Their work as writers and environmentalists was the subject of a thirty minute 1991 WUTF documentary *Visions of Nature* which continues to air periodically in fifty states. They were also the subject of another half hour program in 1983 on the *Disney Channel's* science program, "The Scheme of Things," and may be showing and live of hermit crabs on the *Animal Planet* in 2007.
